I have just returned today from Presidents' Council in Winnipeg. Here are some takeaways; feel free to ask for more information should you be curious.

- Any individual can purchase MTS "Pink Shirt Day/Day of Pink" t-shirts for these two events which happen on February 22nd and April 12th this year respectively. Unisex sizing for S, M, L, & XL shirts are \$7, XXL are \$9, and XXXL are \$11. The t-shirts are also available in French ("Jounée Chemise Rose/Journée Rose"). One day is represented on the front, and the other on the back but dates are not used so the shirts can be worn year after year. If you have not signed up for a session, please contact your school's PD Rep as soon as possible.



ESJ Book Club Report

Our last book, The Inconvenient Indian was a very informative and eye opening experience for myself personally and I would encourage all educators to take the time to read this well written and entertaining account of the history of Indigenous and white relations since Cartier got stranded on the St. Lawrence with his crew, (maybe even earlier).... I find its importance in the details of the dealings with Indigenous nations, the large diverse group of different tribes (over 600) and the incredible resilience that Indigenous nations and peoples have had over the past 2-3 centuries. It brings a sobering and refreshing awareness of a part of Canadian history not well known throughout the general population of North America, and a clearer respect and understanding of a people that were and still are so involved with our North American society. This is just one social justice issue that is percolating around us, and something as we as educators can consider to infuse into our curriculum deliveries...there is always room for Social Justice content in our classrooms.

Going forward our book club is currently reading a new book from professor Amy Cuddy titled 'Presence' which is proving to be another solid read in our series. Personal self-examining books that help us better understand our personal perspectives through a researchers eyes, can only help improve our navigation skills in dealing with work and life scenarios. Treaty Education Kits

The ESJ chair and co-chair attended a Treaty Education Workshop and received 2 Classroom teacher resource kits to use in our division. The K-12 kit will go into the ESJ library located at Emerado Centennial school library, which will be available for all members to use, while the 7-12 kit will go to the NPC library for all to use. The intended goal of the commission is to have a kit in every school in Manitoba for teachers to use. If you're planning or thinking of possibly adding some aboriginal content into your already existing curriculum schedule these kits have a wealth of activities, lesson plans, books, posters and related materials for all grade levels. The intent is to infuse Treaty Ed content into your already existing and running program, not as an add-on unit.

Dental and Vision Plans

This article is a quick reminder about what our dental and vision insurances can provide to GVTA members. It is by no means a complete picture; the most detailed information is available on the Manitoba Teacher Society website. Simply go to *mbteach.org* and choose *Group Benefits* from the *Health and Benefits* drop down menu. You'll come to a page with the link you want: *Extended health plans*, *group dental plans*...

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Dental Plan

Dental benefits are subject to a combined maximum of \$1,500 per person per calendar year. In other words, if you subscribe to a family plan, each person in the family can receive \$1500 worth of benefits per year.

Reimbursements can be summarized as follows:

80% of eligible expenses for basic services like exams, X-rays, cleanings, simple extractions, and fillings.

50% of eligible expenses for major services like in/onlays, crowns, bridges, jackets, and dentures. 50% of eligible expenses for orthodontics for dependent children up to the age of 21 (25 if a student).

Vision Plan

This is actually just part of our Extended Health Plan.

Reimbursements can be summarized as follows:

100% for glasses, lenses, repairs, contacts and laser eye surgery up to a maximum of \$300 per person in a 24 month period.

80% for a single eye exam up to a maximum of \$100 per person in a 24 month period.

As with any insurance, there are limitations and exclusions to both the dental and vision plans. Please consult the MTS website as described above for complete details.

Both the dental and vision plans are administered by Manitoba Blue Cross. Most providers will bill the plans directly. If a provider doesn't, claim forms are available on the Manitoba Blue Cross website. As well, you can also register for a My Blue Cross account and have reimbursements deposited directly into your chequing account.




Print a Class List with Photos

One frequent request I receive from substitute teachers is for teachers to leave them a class list with student photos. This can greatly assist substitute teachers with attendance, as well as with classroom management. It is fairly easy to print these off once, and leave them in your substitute binder, on your desk, or in a plastic sleeve on your white board.

In PowerTeacher, click on the printer icon beside your class.



Select "Class Roster with Photos" from the dropdown. (Mine says "Parkland - Class Roster with Photos")



After clicking "Submit", click "Refresh" on the next screen. Once your list is Completed, click "View", and the Print your new document! You will need to repeat these steps for each unique group of children you teach.

Workload Survey


All MTS members, regardless of their position in schools, are highly encouraged to fill out their workload survey which will be mailed out to schools during the month of February 2017. The purpose of the survey is to provide objective data, collected from members like yourself, to help inform your association's collective bargaining committee about your workload pressures (ie. Time, class or case size, exceptional students, and stressors). This data is used by your local teachers' association in two ways. It provides information which assists:

- 1. Collective bargaining by providing data which is useful in preparation of your association's opening negotiations package (note: associations will generally start negotiations in the fall of 2018); and
- 2. In the event of a bargaining impasse, this information can be used at interest arbitration.

The bottom line is that this information is used to help improve your collective agreement and obtaining as many responses as possible from your association is extremely important to ensure reliable results.

The survey is paper based and should take about 20 minutes of your time to complete. The surveys are completed anonymously as your association only requires aggregate research data. If you have further questions about the survey, please do not hesitate to call your association president for clarification or additional information.

Interested in Facilitating Workshops? Join the Teacher-Led Learning Team (TLLT)

Passion, lifelong learning, experience, leadership, and creativity: What do these words have in common? They describe the work of the Teacher-Led Learning Team (TLLT). The Manitoba Teachers' Society is seeking outstanding classroom teachers, principals, resource teachers, counsellors, clinicians, coaches, and consultants representing all grade levels and subject areas from across the province to design and deliver workshops for school and divisional professional development days.

OVERVIEW OF THE COMMITMENT

TLLT is a two-year appointment, renewable to a maximum of six consecutive years. Successful candidates will deliver up to three workshops per year for which the Society covers leave time and associated expenses. TLLT members are required to attend training seminars and design days at McMaster House. Release time (for school days) and associated expenses are paid.
